# 2014-2015 Proposed School Budget

The following is a summary of the key components of the 2014-2015 Proposed School Budget, which we hope Manhasset residents will find helpful prior to the School Budget Vote on May 20, 2014.

## 1. Bottom Line

- The preliminary working budget proposal totals \$87,933,150.
- The preliminary working budget increase is at Manhasset's tax levy cap of 1.84%.

# 2. Highlights

- The preliminary working budget includes, among other restorations:
  - Most Elementary classes within class size guidelines
  - More moderate class sizes in most secondary school core instructional programs
  - Additional sections offered in certain HS electives across core subject areas
  - 4<sup>th</sup> grade band and orchestra programs, as well as elementary Jazz Ensemble and Chamber Chorus
  - $\circ$  The High School inclusion model for special education students
  - Partial restoration of Middle School clubs
  - Additional 1.0 FTE Social Worker
  - Assistant Varsity and JV coaches
  - o Fulltime Athletic Director

## 3. How Did They Do It?

- Manhasset was able to restore these items and keep within the tax levy cap through cost saving measures including:
  - o Collective bargaining agreements negotiated with the teachers and support staff
  - Retirement incentives for teachers and staff
  - Low percentage increase in healthcare premiums for 2014
  - o Adoption of New York State Pension Stabilization program
  - Lower Special Education costs
  - Efficiencies in Transportation costs

- The annual election and Budget Vote is held statewide the third Tuesday in May to fill seats on the Board of Education and vote on the proposed budget.
